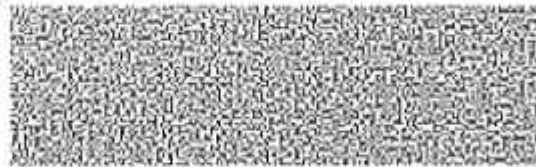
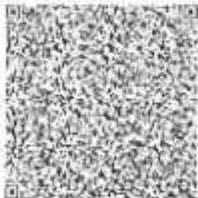

The facility is having a state of art Autoclave system along with the shredder and Incinerator.
- b. M/s **BGS GLOBAL INSTITUTE, MEDICAL SCIENCES & HOSPITAL - KENGERE** its bio-medical waste, properly packed in color-coded bags as per pollution control Board regulations for treatment and final disposal to M/s. **Maridi Bio Industries Pvt Ltd.** The waste should be given at one single point by the M/s. **BGS GLOBAL INSTITUTE, MEDICAL SCIENCES & HOSPITAL - KENGERE** has at given time of M/s. **Maridi Bio Industries Pvt Ltd.** Vehicle.
- c. M/s. **Maridi Bio Industries Pvt Ltd.** will charge a price of Rs.6.80/- per bed per day only (Rupees six rupees & eighty paise per bed per day only) Up to 300 grm per bed per day, excess quantity will be charged at Rs.45/- per kg. (Service Tax Extra as applicable) as agreed for collection, transportation, treatment and final disposal of biomedical waste. This Price will be fixed for a period of one (1) year from date of this agreement and thereafter there will be 12% (Twelve Percent) escalations in the price for every one-year on existing rate.



- j. M/s. **Maridi Bio Industries Pvt Ltd.** will issue a proof of waste collection from M/s. **BGS GLOBAL INSTITUTE, MEDICAL SCIENCES & HOSPITAL - KENGERE** as per your declaration in the application form. This will help the individual hospital for getting compliance with the State Pollution Board. The individual hospital/ Nursing home can take their Authorization from the pollution control board by informing the board that M/s **Maridi Bio Industries Pvt Ltd.** treats their waste (The same has to be mentioned in the Authorization Form).
- k. Maridi is responsible only for the quantity of waste handed over to them by **BGS GLOBAL INSTITUTE, MEDICAL SCIENCES & HOSPITAL - KENGERE** not for all the waste generated at the hospital/clinic/center/diagnostic etc.
- l. In case **BGS GLOBAL INSTITUTE, MEDICAL SCIENCES & HOSPITAL - KENGERE** find any irregularities in collection of waste, they can send a notice in writing to M/s. **Maridi Bio Industries Pvt Ltd.** for immediate action.
- m. M/s **Maridi Bio Industries Pvt Ltd.**, will maintain their plant in good running condition all the time and ensure continuity of service as per agreed with your hospital.

In order to re-utilize wastewater, Institution has approached the above service provider who is in the same business of operating and maintenance of STP Plants and also engaged in well-known reputed organizations by providing its expertise and skilled manpower for managing such services through deputation of required manpower/personnel.

From inception of the above said plant, the Institution has satisfied with the services rendered by the service provider, & on mutual agreed terms by the parties, the institution has agreed to renew the same for further period of ONE YEAR for Operating and Maintenance of the said STP Plant and the Service Provider has also agreed to continuing the same with their quality maintenance services as per terms hereinafter mentioned.

WHEREAS, the terms and conditions of providing the above specialized Services was discussed between the parties, and now this agreement witnesses as under:

01. The Service Provider agrees and undertake to render the specialized Operation and Maintenance of STP Plant, ETP & SEWAGE TRANSFER FROM HOSPITAL SUMP TO Main STP in **THREE SHIFTS** by deploying 3 (three) operators, each shift spread in 8 hours, and it is the responsibility to keep all machineries functioning round the clock, i.e., 365 days of a Calendar year.

02. The Service Provider shall carry out work regarding operation of the STP at 365 days without interruption and also responsible for process control such as loading pattern, dosage of chemicals, maintaining MLSS.
03. Separate Log Book for STP, Hospital ETP, Bio Medical Waste & all other relevant Log books (as prescribed by KPSCB) should be maintained properly for its day to day operations. Periodical inspection should be made in the hospital soak pit level and ETP levels (in case, auto switches is not working, then manually should be operated).
04. To provide all safety gadgets like uniforms, shoes, gloves, helmet, ear plug, face mask etc., to their employees, i.e., all precautions should be taken by the Service Provider about their men and equipments of the plant.
05. Indenting the required consumables well in advance (15 days before the expiry of stock) and submit the same to the in charge officer of the institution and after procured, Consumables/spares inventory books should be maintained properly and it should be produced to the institution for inspection on demand,
06. To provide technical support at the time of trouble shooting, i.e., during plant break down/nonperformance of sewage quality. It is the responsibility of the service provider to keep functioning of all the machineries/equipments. 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notice to the Service Provider to rectify the same within a reasonable time. 
TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF AUTHORISATION

1. The applicant shall comply with the provisions of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and the rules made there under.
2. The authorisation or its renewal shall be produced for inspection at the request of an officer authorised by the prescribed authority.
3. The person authorized shall not rent, lend, sell, transfer or otherwise transport the biomedical wastes without obtaining prior permission of the prescribed authority.
4. Any unauthorised change in personnel, equipment or working conditions as mentioned in the application by the person authorised shall constitute a breach of his authorisation.
5. It is the duty of the authorised person to take prior permission of the prescribed authority to close down the facility and such other terms and conditions may be stipulated by the prescribed authority.
6. Applicant shall take all necessary steps to ensure that bio-medical waste is handled without any adverse effect to human health and the environment and in accordance with these rules.
7. Applicant shall make a provision within the premises for a safe, ventilated and secured location for storage of segregated biomedical waste in colored bags or containers in the manner as specified in Schedule I of the Bio-Medical Waste Management Rules, 2016.
8. Applicant shall ensure that there shall be no secondary handling, pilferage of recyclables or inadvertent scattering or spillage by animals and the bio-medical waste from such place or premises shall be directly transported in the manner as prescribed in these rules to the common bio-medical waste treatment facility or for the appropriate treatment and disposal, as the case may be, in the manner as prescribed in Schedule I the Bio-Medical Waste Management Rules, 2016.
9. Regional officer in the inspection report during inspection dated 19.11.2021 has reported has reported number of beds is 84. Applicant should obtain consent for expansion and operation.
10. Applicant shall pre-treat the laboratory waste, microbiological waste, blood samples and blood bags through disinfection or sterilisation on-site in the manner as prescribed by the World Health Organisation (WHO) or National AIDs Control Organisation (NACO) guidelines and then sent to the common bio-medical waste treatment facility for final disposal;
11. Applicant shall phase out use of chlorinated plastic bags, gloves and blood bags within two years from the date of notification of these rules;
12. Applicant shall dispose solid waste other than bio-medical waste in accordance with the provisions of respective waste management rules made under the relevant laws and amended from time to time;
13. Applicant shall not to give treated bio-medical waste with municipal solid waste;
14. Applicant shall provide training to all its health care workers and others, involved in handling of bio medical waste at the time of induction and thereafter at least once every year and the details of training programmes conducted, number of personnel trained and number of personnel not undergone any training shall be provided in the Annual Report;


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15. Applicant shall immunise all its health care workers and others, involved in handling of bio-medical waste for protection against diseases including Hepatitis B and Tetanus that are likely to be transmitted by handling of bio-medical waste, in the manner as prescribed in the National Immunisation Policy or the guidelines of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare issued from time to time;
16. Applicant shall establish a Bar- Code System for bags or containers containing bio-medical waste to be sent out of the premises or place for any purpose;
17. Applicant shall ensure segregation of liquid chemical waste at source and ensure pre-treatment or neutralisation prior to mixing with other effluent generated from health care facilities.
18. Applicant shall ensure treatment and disposal of liquid waste in accordance with the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 (6 of 1974);
19. Applicant shall ensure occupational safety of all its health care workers and others involved in handling of biomedical waste by providing appropriate and adequate personal protective equipments;
20. Applicant shall conduct health check up at the time of induction and at least once in a year for all its health care workers and others involved in handling of bio- medical waste and maintain the records for the same;
21. Applicant shall maintain and update on day to day basis the bio-medical waste management register and display the monthly record on its website according to the bio-medical waste generated in terms of category and colour coding as specified in Schedule I the Bio-Medical Waste Management Rules, 2016;
22. Applicant shall report major accidents including accidents caused by fire hazards, blasts during handling of bio-medical waste and the remedial action taken and the records relevant thereto, (including nil report) in Form I to the prescribed authority and also along with the annual report;
23. Applicant shall make available the annual report on its web-site and all the health care facilities.
24. Applicant shall inform the prescribed authority immediately in case the operator of a facility does not collect the bio-medical waste within the intended time or as per the agreed time;
25. Applicant shall establish a system to review and monitor the activities related to bio-medical waste management, either through an existing committee or by forming a new committee and the Committee shall meet once in every six months and the record of the minutes of the meetings of this committee shall be submitted along with the annual report to the prescribed authority and the healthcare establishments having less than thirty beds shall designate a qualified person to review and monitor the activities relating to bio-medical waste management within that establishment and submit the annual report;
25. Applicant shall maintain all record for disposal of biomedical waste for a period of five years.
26. The applicant shall immediately adopt bar coding system for Bio medical waste
27. The applicant shall update COVID Bio Medical Waste data in CPCB tracking software at bmw.cpcbcr.com/#/p/login.
28. Applicant shall follow following guideline
 - a. Guidelines for Management of Healthcare Waste in Health Care Facilities as per Bio Medical Waste Management Rules, 2016.
 - b. Guidelines for Bar code System for Effective Management of Bio-Medical Waste.
